

Your Tour Leaders





Tentative Itinerary

Arrival **ᢒ** by evening of June 27, 2020 *Boston*

Settle in at our hotel (the night of the 27th is included in the price of the trip) and see some sights downtown before our trip formally begins in the morning.

Day 1 ❖ Sunday, June 28, 2020 *Boston*

Our tour gets off to a great start with the Red Sox hosting the St. Louis Cardinals at baseball's oldest field, Fenway Park. The rest of the day, you'll have the option to join us on a walking tour of American history or see Boston on your own. (We'll buy everyone transit passes to help you get around.)



Day 2 🔂 Monday, June 29, 2020

Boston to Cooperstown

A well-equipped motorcoach picks us up for a cross-country bus tour that starts with a visit to the <u>Basketball Hall of Fame</u> in Springfield, where a Christian educator named James Naismith invented the sport in 1891. We'll then make our way into upstate New York, where the quaint village of Cooperstown is home to the oldest sports hall of fame in America. (Pending budget and room availability, we'll stay at a historic lakeside resort.)

Day 3 **☆** Tuesday, June 30, 2020 *Cooperstown to Toronto*

We'll spend the morning exploring the history of America's National Pastime at the <u>Baseball Hall of Fame</u>. Then an afternoon bus trip will take us across the border into Canada's largest city, where you'll have time to explore Toronto or see the Blue Jays take on the Chicago White Sox at Rogers Centre.

Day 4 **分** Wednesday, July 1, 2020 *Toronto to Cleveland*

After spending the morning at the <u>Hockey Hall of Fame</u>, we'll make our way around the Great Lakes to Cleveland, Ohio, where you can see the Indians play the Houston Astros or take a break from sports and visit the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.

Day 5 **☆** Thursday, July 2, 2020 *Cleveland to Columbus*

Another morning, another pro sports hall of fame: <u>the football shrine</u> in Canton. Then we'll tour a famous college gridiron before settling in for the night: Columbus' <u>Ohio Stadium</u>, home of the eight-time (as of 2018-19)

national champion Buckeyes.

Day 6 **☆** Friday, July 3, 2020 *Columbus to Louisville*

A morning drive will take us south to Louisville, where we'll tour Churchill Downs and visit the <u>Kentucky Derby Museum</u>. Then you can join us for optional tours of the <u>Muhammad Ali Center</u> or <u>Louisville Slugger Factory</u> — or just enjoy an evening on the riverfront.



Day 7 🌣 Saturday, July 4, 2019

Louisville to Indianapolis

Our second weekend starts in Indiana's capital, where we'll see both the <u>Indianapolis Motor Speedway</u> and the <u>NCAA Hall of Champions</u>. Then we'll celebrate Independence Day with food and fireworks at the Downtown Freedom Fest, or AAA baseball at Victory Field.

Day 8 Sunday, July 5, 2019 Indianapolis to Chicago

Our tour concludes in grand fashion: the Cubs hosting the Tampa Bay Rays for interleague baseball at Wrigley Field, then a summer evening in downtown Chicago.

Deposit, Payments, Cancellations & Refunds

- To be considered for the trip, each applicant must complete and sign a trip application and pay a deposit of \$400. (Parents should sign in place of minor children.) We're planning to take up to 24 people along, but will also maintain a wait list. The deposit is refundable until January 31, 2020, when a second payment of \$1,000 per participant is due. The balance is due no later than April 3, 2020.
- Make all payments by check made out to **Pietist Schoolman Travel LLC**, sent care of Chris Gehrz, 1284 Draper Ave., Roseville, MN 55113.
- We must receive all cancellation notices and refund requests in writing at chris@ pietistschoolman.com. Anyone whose cancellation notice is received between February 1, 2020 and April 3, 2020 will have \$400 per person deducted from the refund in order to cover costs. Any cancellation received between April 4, 2020 and June 12, 2020 will result in a \$1,000 deduction from the refund. Cancellations received after June 12, 2020 will result in no more than a 50% refund.
- If Pietist Schoolman Travel LLC is forced to cancel the entire trip, all payments will be fully refunded.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why isn't airfare included in the trip price?

We've left it out in order to allow participants the flexibility to choose their airline, their points of departure/arrival, and the option of extending travel on either end of the tour. We'll let you know the details of our flights from and back to Minneapolis-St. Paul, in case you'd like to travel with us. Our only expectation is that you are checked in to our hotel in Boston by the evening of June 27, 2020.

Please do not make or pay for any final flight reservations until receiving confirmation from us that the trip is adequately enrolled and officially approved. Pietist Schoolman Travel LLC is not responsible for flight payments made prematurely.

How much physical activity should we expect?

In general, expect tours of halls of fame and other sites to take upwards of 2 hours, with most of that time spent on your feet. But unless you want to explore downtown areas by foot, we don't expect a great deal of walking. As much as possible, we'll try to arrange for our bus to drop off and pick up close to sites, including hotels and sporting venues.

How much free time will we have?

Because of the nature of a cross-country driving tour with scheduled stops at museums, we'll spend most of our mornings and afternoons together. But for the most part, you'll have evenings to yourselves. We'll suggest possible sites to visit, organize historical walking tours as there's interest, and let you know of any additional sporting events that might coincide with our stays.

Are single travelers welcome to join the trip?

This would be a great trip for couples, families, or friends to take together, but you're certainly welcome to travel on you own. You may need to pay a supplement (\$500) when the trip balance is due, in order to cover the added cost of a single-occupancy hotel room — unless the number of solo travelers works out for you to share a room.

What about families?

Definitely! For many of us, love of sports is something shared between the generations. (It's likely that some of our kids will come along.) We welcome girls and boys 10 years old and above, but do require that each family group include at least one adult (18+) for every two minor children.

To travel together as a family (or as a set of more than 2 friends), mark the group line on the application at the end of this brochure. If a family would like to accommodate more than 2 people in hotel rooms, mark that on your application and — depending on hotel policies and availabilities — we'll see if we can arrange for a lower price per person.

Do I have to be a Christian to go on this trip?

No. Our tour leaders are professors at a Christian university, and we'll certainly talk about the relationship between sports and religion at various points along the tour. But we don't expect that everyone on the trip shares our faith.

How can we learn more about sports history before we leave?

We'll provide numerous resources. A few we're considering offering:

- The opportunity to take pre-trip classes from us in spring 2020 (in person or recorded on video)
- Lists of suggested books and films
- A sports history podcast that you can listen to in advance or during downtime on the bus trip
